



BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS OF FOREIGN NATIONAL PRISONERS (FNPs)

Information

1. Right to receive at the moment of arrest and at the commencement of detention or imprisonment, or promptly thereafter, information in a language he understands of his rights and how to avail himself of such rights.
2. Right to be informed of the reasons for the arrest and of the charges in a language the prisoner can understand.
3. Right to inform a person of one's own choice about the detention.
4. Right to receive information about prison rules and the rights and duties of prisoners in a language the prisoner can understand.
5. Right to be informed about consular entitlements, to make contact with consular authorities and to receive visits and consular assistance.
6. Right to be informed about transfer possibilities to the country of origin.

Fair trial

7. Right to an effective remedy and to a fair trial. Everyone who has been charged shall be presumed innocent until proved guilty according to law.
8. Right to receive legal assistance in criminal proceedings.
9. Right to receive free assistance of an interpreter when the prisoner cannot understand or speak the language used in court.
10. Right to be equal before the courts and to be tried without undue delay.
11. Right to be released pending trial, unless a judicial or other authority decides otherwise in the interest of the administration of justice.
12. Right to be considered for the same range of non-custodial sanctions and measures as other suspects.
13. Right not to be subjected to more severe custodial penalties or inferior prison conditions solely because of foreign nationality.
14. Right to be entitled to full consideration for early release.

Treatment

15. Right to be treated with humanity and with respect for the inherent dignity of the human person.
16. Right to be protected from torture or inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment.
17. Right to be treated in a way that takes into consideration the particular situation and individual needs of foreign national prisoners.
18. Right not to be discriminated against (including on grounds such as national origin and language) and to receive effective protection against discrimination.
19. Right to have access to the same health care and treatment programmes that are available to other prisoners.
20. Right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion and freedom to manifest this in worship and observance.
21. Right to wear clothes and to maintain personal hygiene in a way that does not offend the cultural or religious sensibilities of the prisoner and to receive food that takes into consideration cultural and religious requirements.
22. Right to have no unlawful interference in his privacy, family life and correspondence and to make contact (also via visits) with family and friends at regular intervals.

23. Right to receive in prison access to interpretation and translation facilities and the possibility to learn a language to facilitate the communication.
24. Right to have the same access as national prisoners to education, work and vocational training.
25. Right to make without censorship a request or complaint to the central prison administration, the judicial authority or other proper authorities through approved channels.

Resettlement

26. Right to receive treatment that is aimed at reformation and social rehabilitation to prepare for release into society.
27. Right to be informed as early as possible about their legal status and situation after release.
28. Right to be protected from expulsion, return ('refoulement') or extradition to a State where there is a serious risk to be subjected to the death penalty, torture or other inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment.
29. Right to have the consent and the social reintegration of the prisoner taken into account in the decision on transfer to another country.
30. Right to establish relations with outside agencies to receive assistance and support with resettlement after release.
